A short synopsis of each and their book follows.

ALYCE BARRY

Practically Shameless is an uplifting and compassionate guide to transforming your life through Shadow Work. Using a story from the author's life, including a riveting first-person account of Shadow Work processes, this life-affirming narrative demonstrates how to honor your life, understand and befriend your resistance, and effect the lasting change you desire.

STEVEN VEDRO

Digital Dharma, a *User's Guide to Expanding Consciousness in the Age of the Infosphere* (Quest, October 2007) explores the esoteric connection between our planetary nervous system -- the Infosphere -- and our inner levels of consciousness, symbolized by the seven-steps of the chakra system. Is it possible, he asks, that our RFID chips, cell phones, GPS devices and HDTV sets offer more than new ways of communicating with others, but serve as reminders of how we might communicate with our inner spiritual selves? Does the Infosphere reveal our collective digital dharma?

Steven Vedro is an advisor to universities and public broadcasting stations in planning digital media initiatives. His spiritual and personal transformation work includes twenty-five years of meditation practice. Steven is a graduate of the Inner Focus School of Soul Directed Advanced Energy Healing, the Transformational Attunement Program, and is an Elder in the Mankind Project.

BILL KLATTE

It's So Hard To Love You might be best described as "a self-help book for healthy people."
